The Talk

- *Always interested in flower photography in a landscape or as a close-up.
- *Many of the images of flowers were taken in our garden and then parts of the flowers were removed to be photographed or frozen.
- *Inspiration Pierre Joseph Redoute' images on greeting cards Info
- *What is fine art photography.
- *Garden studio get comfortable!
- *Close ups using Sigma 105mm f2.8 close-up lens. Info
- *Depth of field using f16 and f2.8
- *Converted IKEA homemade copy stand add black or white backdrop.

Use torch/

Paper / Carboard backdrops from Hobby Lobby, Michaels etc

- *Images taken in shade.
- *Using a torch <u>Info</u> online half price (many to choose from)
- *Water spray added (old detergent spray).
- *Flower pressing place flower between card/material and put in press.

Method one - in microwave Info Having secured the top of the press and placed in microwave -


FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS AND ONLY LEAVE FOR A VERY SHORT TIME

Method two - cold press Info Secure bolts and wing nuts and leave overnight.

Make your own? Use a heavy book.

- *Most flower images within the size 6 x 4 inches which means the camera does not have to be moved when taking a number of images
- *Original pressed images photographed using homemade cardboard stand and 4 cheap bicycle lights Acceptable white balance.







Make your own camera support ie tripod head fixed to a box instead of using a tripod

- *Life in the freezer flower not completely in water and held in position using Blu Tack. Info
- *When photographing melt with hot water and small areas with warm finger.

Re freeze melted flower and start again.

- *Montage images into the landscape or buildings.
- *Seen better days photograph old flowers.
- *Close-ups of water droplets spray or natural rain use a Rain Repellent spray <u>Info</u> to decrease size of water droplets. Duotone > Mode mono > Duotone blue and white.
- *Putting a frame around images using On1 effects software <u>Info</u> or duplicating an image and stepping its size eg 90%, 80% etc on transparent layers.
- *Still life combining photographs of vases etc and pressed flowers in Photos

Still life in a box – under expose settings eg 4 stops darker, then use flashlight.

Put still life image into Topaz etc.

*Close-ups of insects on flowers using large flash gun – hahnel MODUS 600 RT <u>Info</u> (very fast recycling) and homemade flash reflector

Using Sigma 105mm f2.8 Macro EX DG OS HSM Info

*Macro photography using Canon MP-E 65mm f2.8 1-5 x macro lens Info

hahnel MODUS 360 RT flash gun Info and

homemade reflector - see below

To produce creative insect/flower images.

Settings used

1 / 250 sec (or maximum camera flash synchronisation)

F16 40

400 ASA

Flash ETTL Auto

All images imported as jpg.s. Some software can import PSD.s

Some software can work as stand alone ie not accessed via Photoshop – just drag and drop image into software.

*Adobe Photoshop Info

(Options: PaintShop Pro <u>Info</u> Adobe Elements <u>Info</u> Affinity <u>Info</u> Lightroom <u>Info</u>)

- a) Layers and blending modes What is a texture? eg image of rust, old faded wallpaper, old paving slab etc. Overlay on flower trial and error.
- d) Like a kaleidoscope rotating and duplicating an item start with a **blank square** and rotate item around the centre of the square using settings eg rotate 30, 45 or 60 degrees on each **transparent layer**. On completion of the circle merge visible and duplicate this new layer which should still be transparent. Now reduce size to suite eg 80% and keep on doing this on new layers.

Black or white backgrounds?

- e) Any one for a twirl follow these steps
 - 1 Image

2 In Photoshop: Filter > Pixelate > Mezzotint

Settings: Amount 100, Zoom, Best

- 3 Twirl +125 on 2 above
- 4 Duplicate layer and flip horizontally
- 5 Blend Mode Multiply


Change size and colour etc. Step down image size and/or blend with flower.

Hair line distortion. Can be white or black hairs and different sizes.

- a to produce moody and atmospheric images
- b Also use Al Clear (Artificial Intelligence). Using default settings to remove noise, enhance sharpness etc very quick. NB. Not mentioned in talk

*And now for something completely different


A selection of creative montaged images including an elephant.

*Trees

Tree looking part of a flower eg Ornamental cabbage put into a landscape looking image.

*Copying pressed flowers - method two

Using small and flat 10w Duracell LED floodlight Col temp 5000k. Runs off mains. 20w also available Please note other versions of this light may have to be connected to the mains.



Also used flashlight as fill in lighting

* A "softly softly approach" using Gaussian Blur and Noise

Works well on close ups

Approx. Settings:

Gaussian Blur 100 – you will lose all detail on image

Mono Noise 20 Lower opacity 40

10 Making snow in Photoshop

- 1) Create black layer over image
- 2) Add noise 150
- 3) Filter> Blur> Blur more
- 4) Levels (from left). 160. 1.0. 200
- 5) Layers mode > Screen
- 6) Filter>Pixelate>Crystalize (between 2 and 10 depending on image size)
- 7) Filter> Blur>Motion Blur. Angle 60 Distance 16
- 8) Saved as a PSD you can use this layer it on any image
- 9) Duplicate this layer and enlarge to give bigger snow
- 10) Also lower opacity on snow layers if necessary



11 Making a sphere in Photoshop

Filter > Distort > Spherize - repeat a few times

Adjust shape, Edit > Transfer > Warp

Place in circle to shape

12 Using polar coordinates in Photoshop

Flter > Distort > Polarcoordinates
